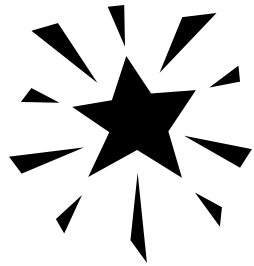

Mobile Outreach Services Team (MOST)



Things appear brighter when troubles and worries are dealt with.

The MOST program is a school based Mobile Mental Health Counseling Program.

The MOST Counselors serve the Auburn Enlarged City School District, Cayuga-Onondaga BOCES, Union Springs, Port Byron and Southern Cayuga schools districts.

The MOST counselors will work with students who are experiencing challenges negotiating through important challenges in their lives.

Student participation is voluntary.

All services are confidential.

Q & A:

Who is eligible for the MOST program?

Students who are in grades 6 through 12, and attend any of the participating school districts.

Why would someone see a MOST Counselor?

To address such issues as: Anger management difficulties, alcohol and drug concerns, feelings of isolation or social difficulties, serious physical fighting with peers or family, chronic school absences, feelings of worthlessness or hopelessness, sudden changes in personality.

How much does this service cost?

Assessment and counseling services are free.

What should I do if I'm interested in this service?
