Life Long Independence for Families in TANF

The Partnership for Results, Inc. in conjunction with Cayuga County Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), is offering an intensive case services program for Temporary Assistance Families.

Families receiving Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) need to comply with educational, vocational, and treatment related regulations designed to assist them with eventual self-sufficiency. When families find it difficult to meet these conditions, they can be sanctioned. Sanctions often include a reduction in benefits for a certain amount of time. These sanctions are often difficult for families who are already struggling financially.

The L.I.F.T. program provides assessment and recommendations for all family members to help them prevent future sanctions while promoting self-sufficiency.

Who are the staff of the L.I.F.T. program?

Each family is assigned a master's level case manager. These case managers are trained in home based interventions and broad based family assessment. The case manager meets regularly with the family to help determine the best recommendations to prevent future sanctions and promote self-sufficiency. Families are assisted with their educational, vocational, and other treatment planning goals.
