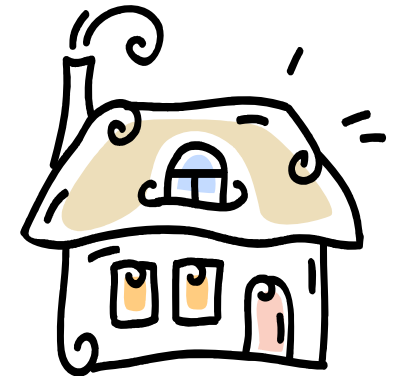

Multidimensional Family Support Program

The Partnership for Results, Inc. in conjunction with Cayuga County Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), is offering an intensive clinically based program for families involved with HHS who have children that are:

1. at risk of removal from their home to a higher level of care
2. at risk of removal from their current foster home to a higher level of care
3. transitioning out of custody back to their homes
4. transitioning from residential placement to home/foster home
5. needing support during their post adoption transitions.

Who are the staff of the MFS program?

Each family is assigned a master's level clinician from the Partnership. The clinician and family collaborate to determine the best intervention and services that will support the family and allow the child to maintain his/her current placement. The clinician, who is trained in home-based interventions and broad based family assessment, provides clinical intervention.

Case managers from the Partnership are available to provide additional community support.

The family's case worker from Health and Human Services continues to provide case management.
