PINS Prevention and Treatment Program (PPT)

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The Partnership for Results, is a comprehensive, community-wide collaboration dedicated to fostering the healthy development of children in Cayuga County from infancy through the age of 21.

PINS Prevention and Treatment (PPT)

What is the PINS Prevention and Treatment Program (PPT)?

It is a voluntary, community based service to provide assessment and treatment in natural settings to students in grades 6-12 who are either:

- (1) exhibiting behavioral problems and/or truancy issues in their schools which could result in filing a PINS diversion referral if they continued or
- (2) referred through Cayuga County Family Court.

PPT is collaborative treatment and case management approach for the student and student's family.

The intervention will range from 1-4 months, depending on the results of a comprehensive assessment process.

PPT uses therapeutic techniques that effectively reduce problem behaviors and the likelihood of the filing of a PINS petition.

What does PPT do?

- ❖ Comprehensive case planning designed to meet individual needs of student and family in an intensive mode.
- ❖ Community-based supervision and treatment for full duration of PPT with student and family.
- ❖ A variety of individual, group and family counseling methods matched to meet the needs of the student and family.
- ❖ Case management and therapeutic support and advocacy for student success at home, school and community.
- ❖ Creates opportunities for student achievement and decision-making
- ❖ 24 hour crisis management for the student and family

How are students referred?

1. Students must be in grades 6-12 and have had multiple absences and/or in school suspensions and/or out of school suspensions. Students can also be referred by court after a PINS diversion referral is filed.
2. Students can be referred by any Auburn City or BOCES school personnel or through Cayuga County Family Court.
3. Each school has a target person who is responsible for completing referral forms and submitting them to the PPT Supervisor.
4. The PPT Supervisor will contact student and guardian to arrange an appointment.
